Our topic this term is our local area. Over the next six weeks you need to complete one task each week and hand it in by Wednesday. Please write the task at the top of your 'Home Learning Book' and then place your homework underneath it. You will also need to complete the spelling task each week.

English

- Can you write 5 sentences to describe your favourite gift from the Christmas holiday using adjectives and commas in a list? What did it look like? How did it work? What can you do with it?
- Can you write some instructions to tell an alien how to wash his hands? Remember to include numbers and bossy 'imperative' words such as 'rub'!
- Can you read a story and write 8 different sentence openers you find in it which you think are good to use in your writing? Remember these are words that the sentences start with.

Maths

- Can you choose 3 numbers (1-9) and then add them together? What is the biggest/ smallest number you can make? Which number is the most popular answer?
- Go on a walk around your local area, spot numbers and write them in your book. Next, to the number can you identify if it is odd or even? I.e. 30 = Even
- Can you investigate the different colours of cars on your street and draw a tally chart to show the results? Which was the most popular colour?

Topic

- Can you measure how many beats your heart does in one minute, then do 10 minutes of exercise with a grown-up such as running or jumping and then measure how many beats your heart does after? Is it more or less beats?
- Can you do a pencil sketch of a building you can see from your window? Remember to add detail such as windows, door numbers and any patterns.
- Can you create a poster, in French, about a number we have learnt to count to? Will you choose 5 and then draw 5 objects or a different number?
- Can you use things from around your house to create a short piece of music to describe our local area?
