38 **Ingredients:**

- 42 • 6 ounces self-raising flour
- 45 • 2 teaspoons honey
- 48 • 1 teaspoon sugar
- 51 • 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ounces margarine
- 55 • 1 level teaspoon cinnamon



56 **Method:**

- 64 1. Beat sugar and margarine until it becomes
68 a soft, creamy consistency.
- 78 2. Sieve flour and cinnamon; add it to the mixture.
- 88 3. Mix with a wooden spoon to bind the mixture together;
96 knead with fingers until the dough becomes soft.
- 104 4. Roll between floured palms into 16 balls.
- 113 5. Place the dough on a lightly greased baking
118 tray, flattening the rolls slightly.
- 128 6. Bake in a medium oven for about 15 mins.
