

As Writers we will be learning:

To write narratives from the point of view of April, the main character in our novel and the next book in the sequence.

We will also be learning to write a set of instructions and a diary entry from the stance of an evacuee during WW2!



As Mathematicians we will be:



Reconnecting with our previous learning on place value and expanding to be confident identifying, reading, writing, ordering and comparing numbers up to 1000000! We will deepen our learning further by finding factors, common factors, prime numbers, prime factors, multiples, common multiples, square numbers and square roots. This will all link to our ongoing work on learning our times tables – knowing our times tables will help us so much with the rest of our work in maths!

We will also be learning the skills needed to add and subtract 6-digit numbers including decimals and lots more to further our numerical understanding, all whilst problem solving and reasoning!

In other lessons, we will be:

using the Micro Bits coding programme to design and make more complex programs. We will use a range of variables and functions in order to execute a variety of different functions.

In RE, we will be exploring the values of Hinduism and building the skills needed in order to answer our key question of 'How does the faith of a Hindu impact their lifestyle?'.

As Artists we will be:

Exploring the work of Laurence Stephen Lowry. We will look closely at a selection of his work paying close attention to the mood and atmosphere created in his paintings. We will then use his work to inspire our own scenes linked to our learning about World War II.



As Scientists we will be learning about:



Animals including Humans. We will be looking closely at the six stages of human development, the changes that occur in adolescence and why this happens. We will also be making comparisons between humans and other mammals – investigating how the development of alternate mammals differs from our own. Throughout this topic we will be using many skills when working scientifically as well as exploring notable scientists related to this area.

Autumn 1: World War II

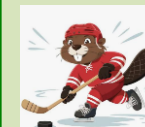
